Here Prof Viña combines his teaching duties with research work, the latter in two main lines: Ageing and exercise.

José Viña leads a successful research group working on different aspects of oxidative stress with whom he has won numerous prizes for research work; he has published widely on glutathione, mitochondria, oxidative stress, free radicals and nutrition.
